LAST DAY FOR FREE MEALS FOR ALL STUDENTS: Friday, December 23, 2022

PAID MEALS START Wednesday, January 4, 2023
for students who have not been approved for free or reduced-price lunch.

Killingly Public Schools has been participating in the School Meals Assistance Revenue for Transition (SMART) funds, which has allowed all students to temporarily receive free breakfast and lunch meals regardless of family income. **Our allocation of SMART funds will provide funding for free meals through December 23, 2022.** On January 4, 2023, the district will revert to charging for meals for all students who have not been approved for free or reduced-price meals by means of an application or direct certification from the State of CT.

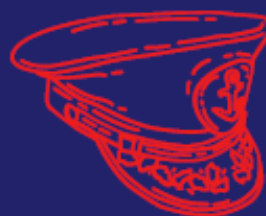

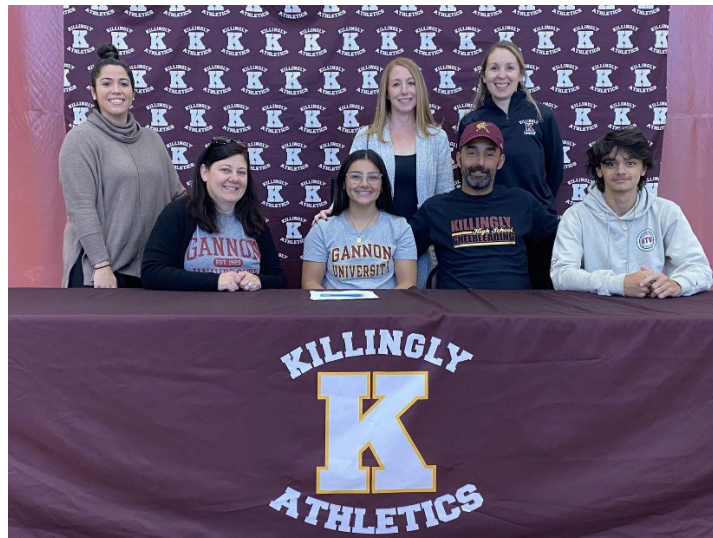

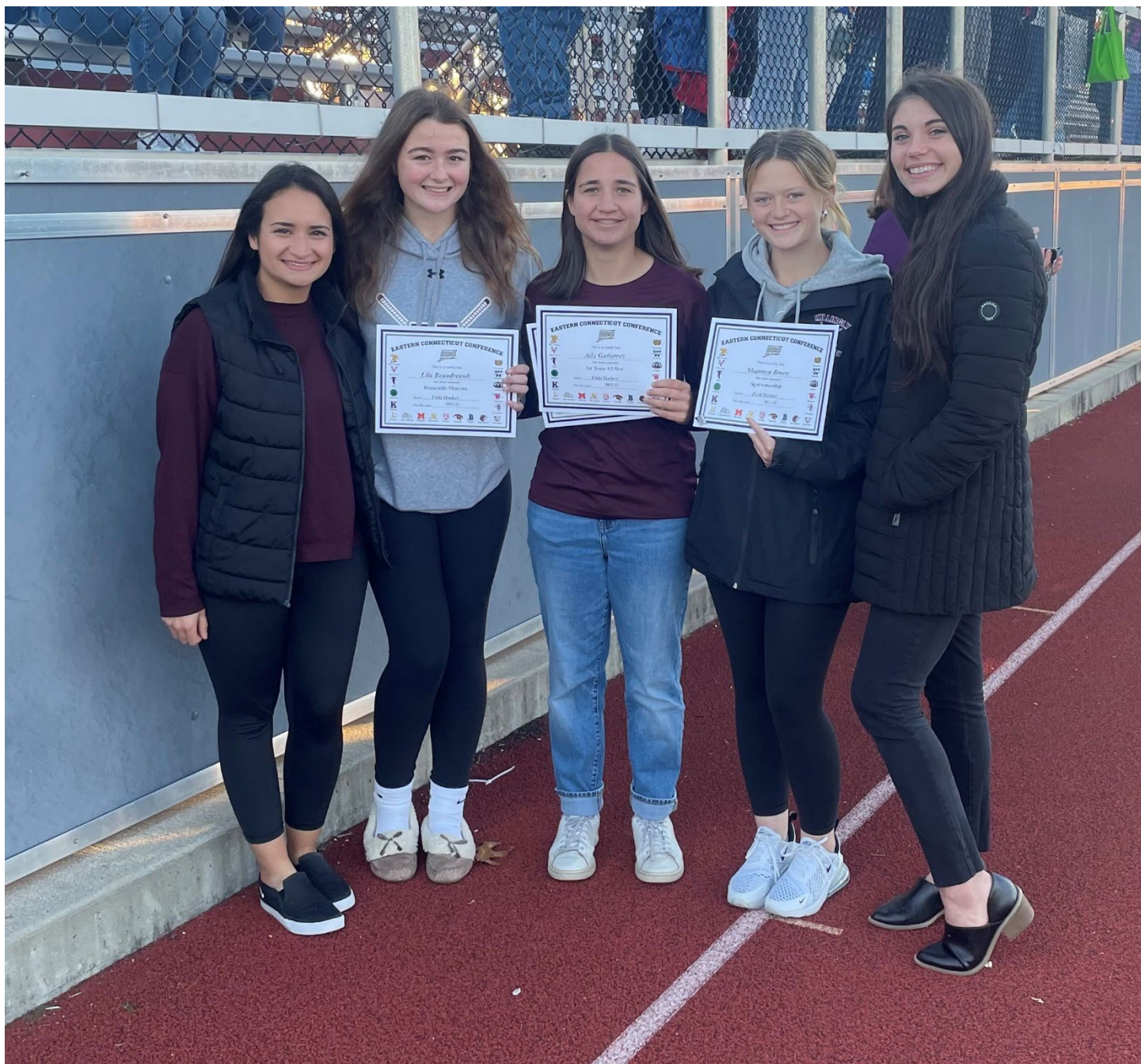
The Oratorical Contest is held annually at the Post, District, State and National levels, with winners of each moving on to the next level.
