

RESTON, VA October 22, 2019)—During the 2018–19 school year, along with other accomplished music students across the United States and overseas in military base schools, **Joliana Reynolds** from **Killingly High School** practiced with dedication to gain a chair or part in their local, district, and state music honor ensembles.

And now **Ms. Reynolds** will join the "best of the best" for the National Association for Music Education (NAfME) 2019 All-National Honor Ensembles November 7–10, 2019, at the Gaylord Palms Resort and Convention Center in Orlando, Florida.

Ms. Reynolds is a proven leader in her music classes at Killingly High School. In order to gain a seat in the All-National Choir, she first had to earn seats in the Connecticut Eastern Regional Choir and then, the Connecticut All-State Choir. To do this, she participated in auditions and was scored by a panel of judges. Ms. Reynolds is a choir officer at KHS, has appeared in spring musicals, and has been featured as a soloist with KHS choirs. She looks forward to a future in music and hopes to major in music education or music therapy.

The All-National Honor Ensembles performers represent collaboration and creativity in its highest musical form. The All-National Honor Ensembles consist of a concert band, symphony orchestra, mixed choir, jazz ensemble, guitar ensemble (now in its second year), and modern band (new this year). Students were chosen through an audition process. The concert band and symphony orchestra will each have 119 and 121 instrumentalists respectively, the jazz ensemble 20 instrumentalists, the mixed choir 240 vocalists, the guitar ensemble 41 instrumentalists, and the modern band 16 performers.
