Dear Killingly Families,

Our school system follows the CT State Travel Advisory Executive Orders, which require quarantine in many travel circumstances.

Reporting Student Travel and Return from Travel Requirements

- Please notify your school nurse prior to travel to any state or country on the CT <u>Travel Advisory list.</u> The state list is updated every Tuesday, so be sure you are aware of the most updated information.
- 2. Students who return from spending more than 24 hours in a state/country on the Travel Advisory list are required by the current State of CT Order to guarantine for 14 days.
- 3. You may choose to shorten the 14 day quarantine period by having a PCR COVID test with negative test results. If you choose this option, follow the process outlined below. A full explanation of state requirements follows as well.
 - The Rapid COVID-19 test is not allowed under state law in lieu of the 14 day travel quarantine. The State allows a PCR COVID test with negative results instead of the 14 day travel quarantine
 - You must send the written PCR test results to your school nurse.
 - You must also send a copy of the email notice you sent to the state requesting that your quarantine be shortened by your negative PCR test results. See state explanation below.
 - Your school nurse will inform you of your return to school and school activities date based on the documents (PCR test/email notice) you submit.

Excerpts from the CT Travel Advisory website: (subject to change)

Can travelers be tested for COVID-19 instead of self-quarantine?

Yes, an Affected Traveler is exempt from the self-quarantine requirement if the Affected Traveler:

- (1) has had a test for COVID-19 in the seventy-two (72) hours prior to arrival in Connecticut or at any time following arrival in Connecticut.
- (2) the result of such COVID-19 test is negative, and
- (3) he or she has provided written proof of such negative test result to the Commissioner via email to: DPH.COVID-Travel@ct.gov or via facsimile to: (860) 326-0529.

If a test was obtained in the seventy-two (72) hours prior to arrival in Connecticut, or following arrival in Connecticut, and such Affected Traveler has not yet received his or her test results, such traveler shall remain in self-quarantine in Connecticut until a negative test result is submitted to the Commissioner. If the test result is positive and the traveler is asymptomatic, he or she shall self-isolate for ten (10) days from the date of the test; if symptomatic, he or she should seek medical assistance.

Travelers who test positive for COVID-19 prior to traveling to Connecticut should delay such travel and consult with a medical professional. All Affected Travelers are required to complete the <u>Travel Health Form.</u>

What tests are acceptable for the testing option? Nucleic acid tests such as reverse transcriptase polymerase chain reaction (RT-PCR) tests are the only acceptable testing option. Neither rapid antigen tests nor antibody tests for COVID-19 satisfy the testing requirement for the testing exemption.

COVID PROTOCOLS

This is a friendly reminder for parents to monitor your child's health daily. We are coming upon flu season and monitoring symptoms is key to keeping our community healthy and safe. If any symptoms listed below are present, please keep your child home and notify the school nurse, Susan Spagnuolo, at 860-779-6725.

Symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure to COVID 19.

SYMPTOMS CAN INCLUDE:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body ache
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

If your child has had contact with a person who has COVID-19, keep your child home and notify the school nurse.

WHAT COUNTS AS CLOSE CONTACT?

- You were within 6 feet of someone who has COVID-19 for a total of 15 minutes or more
- You provided care at home to someone who is sick with COVID-19
- You had direct physical contact with the person (hugged or kissed them
- You shared eating or drinking utensils
- You were sneezed or coughed upon, or somehow got respiratory droplets on you
